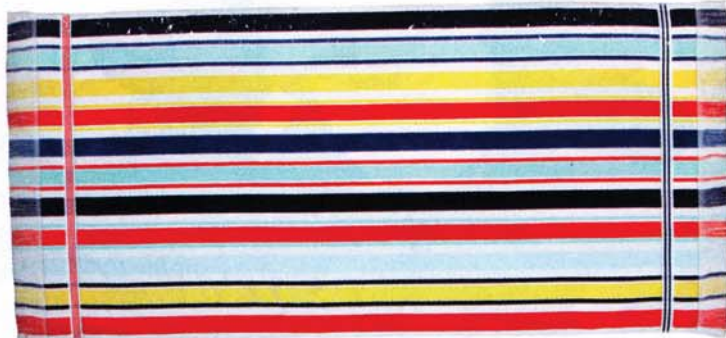

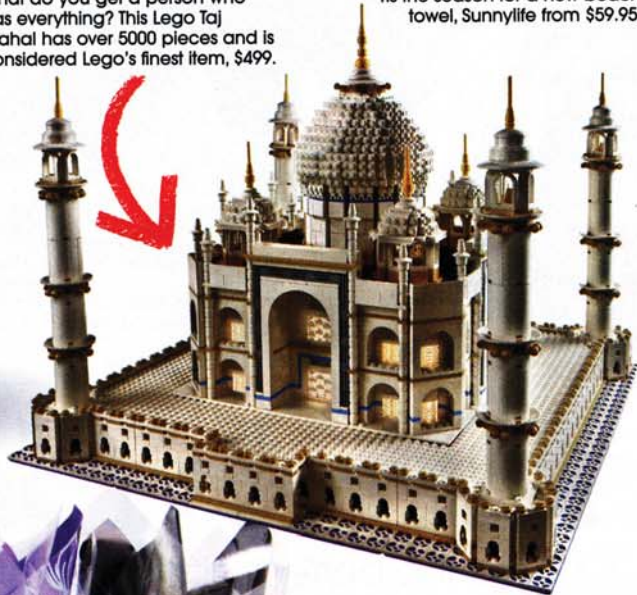

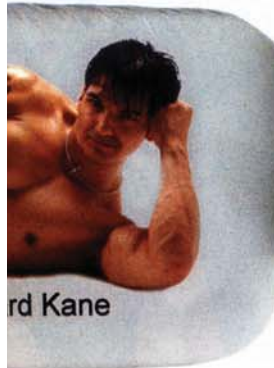

### Living gifts

There's no better gift for a gardener at Christmas than something green.

By green I mean plants or something useful in the garden!

I have several plants in my garden given to me as presents and I always remember who I received them from. They're presents I always cherish, especially when they're flowering.

Plants are inexpensive gifts and easy to choose if you know the person it's going to.

Friends with not so green thumbs are better given low-maintenance plants such as succulents which will grow quite happily in a pot in a sunny position.

You can jazz up your living gift by putting it into a lovely ceramic pot which can be put on the table at Christmas for decoration. Poinsettias are very popular plants for gifts at this time of the year as they are in full flower and have very festive red flower bracts - the flower is actually the unspectacular little yellow bit in the centre!

If you don't want to give a plant then maybe something more useful. A pair of secateurs start at \$20 and go right up to \$200 for a quality pair but they're well worth it when you consider how long and often they'll be used. You could also consider garden clogs (around \$50), gardening gloves (\$5-15) or even a subscription to a gardening magazine.

For kids, there's always the alfalfa-sprout pack, a kids' garden book or starter garden tool set to get them keen and active in the garden. ■
